

BRIDPORT TOWN HALL

HERITAGE AND CONSERVATION PROJECT

Bridport Town Council's exciting project, due to be completed at the end of 2011, will preserve and open up this Grade 1 Listed building for everyone to visit and enjoy.

Work is underway to provide level access to the building from Bucky Doo Square. A new lift is being installed so that everyone can visit and take part in a range of activities in the historic rooms on the first floor.



Newbery: *Shipbuilding*

The interior of the Town Hall was redesigned in September 1925 by Francis H. Newbery, former Director of the Glasgow School of Art. Newbery, who grew up in Bridport, painted and presented to the town a series of panels and paintings depicting key elements of our local history. This project will repair and conserve the Newbery interior and paintings on the first floor.

The Town Council is also improving the facilities on offer, including the heating, lighting, acoustics, kitchen and IT provision as well as improving the energy efficiency of the building.

In addition, there will be a new community exhibition space at the southern end of the ground floor alongside proposed new accommodation for the Tourism Information Centre.
